

## Rationale

- Mild cystitis cases can be defined as those that are responsive to symptomatic treatment but will also clear up on their own. If symptoms do not
  improve within 3 days, despite self care measures, then the patient should be advised to see their GP.
- Symptomatic treatment using products that reduce the acidity of the urine to reduce symptoms are available, but there is a lack of evidence to suggest they are effective.

## **Recommendations for clinicians**

- Provide the patient with a 'non-prescription' sheet or a patient information leaflet to promote education about self-limiting conditions suitable for selfcare when appropriate.
- Advise patients of safe and effective self-care measures:
  - > Using a hot water bottle on the stomach, back or between the thighs.
  - > Rest and drink plenty of fluids this helps the body to flush out the bacteria
  - > Wipe from front to back after using the toilet
  - > Take painkillers e.g. paracetamol or ibuprofen
  - > Avoid sex and urinate frequently
- Advise patients to seek medical attention and consider treatment with a prescription in the following circumstances:
  - > When 'red flag symptoms' (signs of kidney infection) such as pain in the lower back, fever, diarrhoea and vomiting are present.
  - > Symptoms have not cleared up after 3 days.
  - > If the patient is elderly, pregnant, male or a child
  - > If blood is present in the urine.
  - If symptoms return after treatment.
