Self Care Briefing – Minor conditions associated with pain, discomfort and fever



Rationale

In most cases headaches, period pain, mild fever and back pain can be treated at home with over-the-counter painkillers and lifestyle changes, such as
getting more rest and drinking enough fluids. Examples of conditions where patients should be encouraged to self- care include: headaches, colds, fever,
earaches, teething, period pain, cuts, self-limiting musculoskeletal pain, sprains, bruising, toothache, sinusitis/nasal congestion, recovery after a simple
medical procedure, aches and pains and sore throat.

Recommendations for clinicians

- Provide the patient with a 'non-prescription' sheet or a patient information leaflet to promote education about self-limiting conditions suitable for self-care when appropriate. - Advise patients of safe and effective self-care measures:
 - > Consult a pharmacist for advice as to which treatment is most suitable
 - > Do some gentle exercise or distract yourself
 - > Breathe right and concentrate on your breathing to ease pain and relax
- · Patients should seek medical attention if:
 - > Pain keeps coming back, worsens or if painkillers do not work
 - > Flu like symptoms don't improve after 7 days
 - > If swelling is present around the ear, earache in both ears, earache for more than 3 days, hearing loss or a change in hearing
 - > Severe period pain or your normal pattern of your periods changes
 - > There are signs of infection i.e. redness, severe pain , feeling hot and swollen at site of pain
