## **Self Care Briefing – Warts and Verrucae**



## Rationale

• Warts and verrucae can be treated without the need for a GP consultation or prescription in the first instance. They can easily be treated with simple over the counter preparations that are readily available. Warts usually resolve spontaneously especially in children.

## **Recommendations for clinicians**

- Provide the patient with a 'non-prescription' sheet or a patient information leaflet to promote education about self-limiting conditions suitable for self-care when appropriate. See: <a href="https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/warts-and-verrucas/">https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/warts-and-verrucas/</a>
- Advise patients of safe and effective self-care measures:
  - > Wash hands after touching the wart/verruca and avoid biting nails or sucking fingers with warts on them
  - > Take care not to cut a wart when shaving and avoid scratching or picking a wart
- Advice to patients : Warts/verrucae:
  - > do not usually cause harm
  - > will resolve spontaneously, usually within months
  - > treatments may be prolonged and may cause adverse effects e.g. local skin irritation. Apply petroleum jelly to surrounding skin to decrease irritation.
  - > are contagious use waterproof plasters/duct tape if swimming, wear flip-flops in communal wet areas and do not share footwear and towels
  - > File the wart with a disposable emery board before applying treatments. Dispose of skin filings hygienically and do not use the emery board elsewhere to avoid spreading the warts. Apply treatment at night.
- Patients should seek medical attention if:
  - > The wart/verrucae are on the face or genital area.
  - The wart/verrucae start to bleed , have changed in appearance recently or keeps coming back
  - > The wart/verrucae are very large, are in a large cluster or are painful

Example of products available to buy over the counter\*

Salicylic Acid

Bazuka/Salactol®/Occlusal® - not to be used on facial/anogenital warts; not for use in diabetic patients or those with impaired circulation; Not licensed for children under 2 years (£1.70-£9.00 per pack)

Glutarol ®10% w/v cutaneous solution – Licensed for adults and children (~33.31 for 10ml)

Verrugon® ointment for verrucas – Not licensed for children under 7 years (~£4.99-£6.49 for 6g)
